Where did we obtain your address?

For the survey, we are working with the residents' registration office (Einwohnermeldeamt) in your city, which has provided us with the addresses. This provision of data only takes place if the project – like ours – is in the public interest, adheres to strict scientific principles and guarantees compliance with data protection regulations (Art. 6 [1] 1 lit. e GDPR in conjunction with Section 13 Bremen Implementation Act for the EU General Data Protection Regulation [BremDSGVOAG], Section 46 Federal Citizens' Registration Act [BMG]). The purpose of data processing is to contact you regarding participation in our above-mentioned research project. Your participation is voluntary. If you do not participate, you will not suffer any disadvantage as a result.

What will happen to your information?

Your personal data (name and address) and information from the survey will, of course, be treated as strictly confidential and stored separately on a secure server. Information about certain personal attributes – such as your age or your level of education – is only used in the evaluation to distinguish between the life situations of different population groups. All information is converted into numbers and stored separately from your personal data. We can only find out who provided the information with considerable effort using your personal access code (pseudonymisation). Your personal data will be deleted after 6 months. Therefore, revocation and deletion of your data from the survey are only possible up to 6 months after participation (anonymisation). Your data will be handled in accordance with the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). The legal basis for processing is personal consent (Art. 6 [1] lit. a, Art. 9 [2] lit. a GDPR).

Your participation in the survey is very important for the success of the study. This is because we will only be able to obtain a complete picture of the living conditions in your district if as many residents as possible who receive our letter complete the questionnaire.
